Letter from the President by Dick Cashwell '59

Dear fellow alum:

I hope all is well with you and your family this spring.

Since our last newsletter, the Unit has been steady on course. Compared to my era at UNC, the size of the unit is staggeringly small. My fear at this point is that NROTC will disappear from the UNC campus.

To me there are two factors that may make this fear a reality. One is the Navy's push for a more technically trained officer corps, and the other is its commitment to protecting the size of the Naval Academy.

I am not sure we can do anything

about the Navy's view on the Academy, but I do think we can work with UNC to keep a viable program at Chapel Hill. There are good hard science programs at UNC, and the Unit needs to keep those programs in the mind of the Navy.

We Alumni, particularly those on active duty, need to keep reminding the Navy that a UNC NROTC graduate is a highly skilled, motivated and welleducated leader. Our non-active duty members need to stress to anyone who can influence the Navy's decision makers that "ROTCee" grads provide a needed diversity of ideas within

the Navy.

I hope you will come to the general meeting and reunion October 28th and that you will try to get a classmate to join you. This fall's reunion should be particularly fun, with a couple of extra events to round out the weekend and allow more time for camaraderie.

As always, we need to push for membership in our Association. The more members we have, the more we can influence the Navy and the University.

Afghanistan Report

Fellow Alumni:

In December 2005 I deployed to Afghanistan as an Individual Augment for the Combined Forces Command staff in Kabul. I was originally assigned to the J2 and spent about six weeks leading the analysis section in the Human Intelligence shop. I then joined the Command Group as the Commanding General's Special Assistant. Although not

the job I would have asked for, it turned out to be a great experience. I traveled to 25 forwardoperating bases and Provincial


Two New Flags

Vandals attacked buildings used by ROTC at N.C. State and UNC in late April.


